

TOGETHER COLORADO HOUSING LEGISLATIVE PRIORITY HB21-1117:

Local Government Authority Promote Affordable Housing Units

Everyone in Colorado, no matter their race or zip code, should have access to shelter and housing. However, certain politicians and wealthy developers make it difficult for many of us to afford to live in Colorado, and home is pushed out of reach for many Coloradans.

HB21-1117

This bill would remove Colorado's prohibition on local governments from negotiating affordable housing requirements in new development proposals and redevelopment projects.

Every community in Colorado is unique. By removing this barrier, HB21-1117 empowers local officials, if they choose to use it, to meet the needs of their communities and offers a variety of ways to provide affordable housing.

Local solutions could include requiring that a certain number or percentage of new housing units meet certain affordability requirements.
