But today, a special interest group is trying to pass ballot measure 2F to take away our options to share housing costs with roommates.

WHAT WOULD 2F DO?

- Limit the number of unrelated adults who can legally live together to only two
- Take away affordable housing options for Denver residents

WHO WOULD BE IMPACTED?

Intergenerational families, low-income adults, unmarried couples, students, and anyone seeking to share housing costs

Coming together, we must VOTE NO on 2F to send a strong message that all of us - Black, white, and brown - regardless of age or income, belong in Denver.

REASONS TO VOTE NO ON 2F:

This law would make it harder for people to share housing costs in Denver.



The average monthly rent in Denver is \$1670. Residents of Denver like teachers, nurses, and students need the option to share housing costs with roommates.



This would make Denver's housing laws among the most restrictive in the state.



With skyrocketing housing costs and stagnant wages, residents of Denver need all of their options for affordable housing, including living with roommates.
